Tom Malone ...Without Intent or Scheme

Tom Malone lived his life as a free spirit devoted to friends, art and music. Aware of the purpose in all things, he commonly filled his pockets with found objects always thinking "I can do something with that." He often returned anything unused to its original place. As a utilitarian, Tom detested waste and often recycled his "dumpster diving" treasures, creating woodcarvings and jewelry from discarded wood. As a neck inspector for Gibson in Nashville, TN he learned the fine art of stringed instruments.

Musically, Tom possessed natural talent. He played tunes on his guitars and harps from memory and the sound of his band *The Funky Jazz Beavers* often drew a crowd from the club next door.

Following his sudden death in 1998 and the discovery of two sealed envelopes filled with Tom's musical compositions, his father Charles Malone and his close friend Chuck Emery began work to professionally produce an album of original music. In 2000, *Open Windows* debuted in Clarksville with the proceeds benefiting a scholarship in Tom's name at Austin Peay State University.

Nearly a decade after his death, those closest to Tom remember his flair for life, his devotion to friends and his unique artistic and musical style.
